Computer Forensics

Computer forensics is the scientific examination and analysis of data on, or retrieved from, computer storage media in such a way that the information can be used as evidence in a court of law.

Computer Crime Investigation (CCT 121)

This course introduces the fundamental principles of computer crime investigation processes. Topics include crime scene/incident processing, information gathering techniques, data retrieval, collection and preservation of evidence, preparation of reports and court presentations. Upon completion, students should be able to identify cyber crime activity and demonstrate proper investigative techniques to process the scene and assist in case prosecution.

- The secure collection of computer data
- The examination of suspect data to determine details such as origin and content
- The presentation of computer based information to courts of law
- The application of a country's laws to computer practice.

Computer Forensics Certificate

As computer usage becomes more ingrained in our society it is evident that computers will increasingly be used in various types of crime. This certificate is designed to give the student a foundational understanding of the criminal investigative process, accepted court procedure concerning evidence collection and preservation, the fundamentals of computer hardware, and current trends and tools used to mine and retrieve data within a personal computer. This certificate would be especially useful for law enforcement investigators, corporate loss prevention and fraud personnel, auditors, and other persons with an interest or need in computer forensics.
